## Armed Forces Day Crossband Test

On May 16, 2026, amateur radio operators across the United States take part in the annual Armed Forces Day Crossband Test. This event, coordinated by U.S. military stations, is designed to demonstrate interoperability between military and civilian radio systems.

During the test, military stations transmit on military frequencies while simultaneously listening on designated amateur radio bands. Amateur operators cannot transmit on military frequencies, so they respond on the assigned amateur frequencies to complete a valid "crossband" contact.

Participants attempt to make two-way communications with stations representing different branches of the armed forces, including the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and Marine Corps. Each station provides specific frequencies, operating times, and call signs in advance.

Operators exchange basic information such as call signs and signal reports. Some stations also offer certificates to those who successfully complete contacts.

The event highlights radio readiness, technical skill, and the long-standing relationship between amateur radio operators and the military. It also serves as a practical exercise in communication under varying band conditions across multiple frequencies.

The Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club, Inc., (HRAC) formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways, HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the hamfest, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: Oktoberfest. Third: the well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

## HAM HISTORY

### Important Happenings in the Month of May

May is a significant month in amateur radio history, marked by key events in regulatory, historical, and modern operational contexts.

- May 28, 1941 (Saint Maximilian Kolbe): Fr. Maximilian Kolbe, SP3RN, was transferred to Auschwitz after being arrested by the Germans, who believed his amateur radio activities were involved in espionage. He is now recognized as the patron saint of amateur radio operators.
- May 1916 (First Nationwide Relay): The May 1916 Electrical Experimenter reported on the first successful nationwide amateur radio relay that took place on Washington's Birthday (Feb 22, 1916), moving messages from coast to coast.
- May 1917 (WWI Suspension): The May 1917 issue of QST carried the announcement of a "WAR!"—a total suspension of amateur sending and receiving activities in the United States, urging amateurs to join the military.
- May 15, 1921 (Massive Solar Storm): A massive coronal mass ejection (CME) caused a "superstorm" that burst telegraph and telephone offices into flames and caused auroras in tropical locations, impacting global communications.
- May 23, 1947 (WNAM Founded): The station WNAM, a significant AM station with a long history, signed on the air.
- Four Days in May (FDIM): An annual, large gathering of QRP (low-power) operators, held by the QRP Amateur Radio Club International in Ohio, traditionally occurs in May, featuring technical seminars and homebrew contests.
- Armed Forces Day Crossband Test: Traditionally held in May, this is an annual opportunity for amateur operators to test their communications capabilities with military radio stations.
- May 1916 (First Nationwide Relay): The May 1916 Electrical Experimenter reported on the first successful nationwide amateur radio relay that took place on Washington's Birthday (Feb 22, 1916), moving messages from coast to coast.

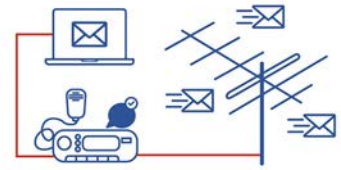
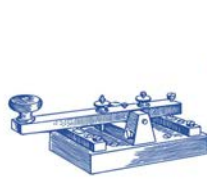

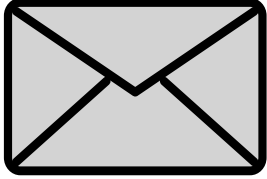
