The Harrisburg Radio Amateurs Club, Inc., (HRAC) formed 1 July 1946, as an association of individuals commonly interested in amateur radio, based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It is an ARRL affiliate club.

At the end of World War II, many veterans returned to the Harrisburg area trained and used radio communications in the military. It soon became a common factor among local hobby enthusiasts. Fifty-eight charter members developed the original constitution and bylaws for the club. In 1960, HRAC became a non-profit corporation in Pennsylvania.

The club continues to promote amateur radio in the area in many ways. HRAC is involved with young people by helping with scouting's JOTA activities and promoting amateur radio with school clubs and organizations.

Since 1949, members have provided communications for the American Red Cross in Harrisburg for Dauphin County and Pennsylvania Emergency Management. In addition, we conduct periodic training sessions for emergency responders.

HRAC has three hamfests throughout the year: July's Firecracker Hamfest is always the Saturday before the first Sunday in July. During the hamfest, you may hear special event station W3UU from the hamfest tailgating area. We set up and operate W3UU to demonstrate amateur radio and invite operators to join in and make contacts. Second: Oktoberfest. Third: the well attended WinterFest in January is an indoor tailgate fest.

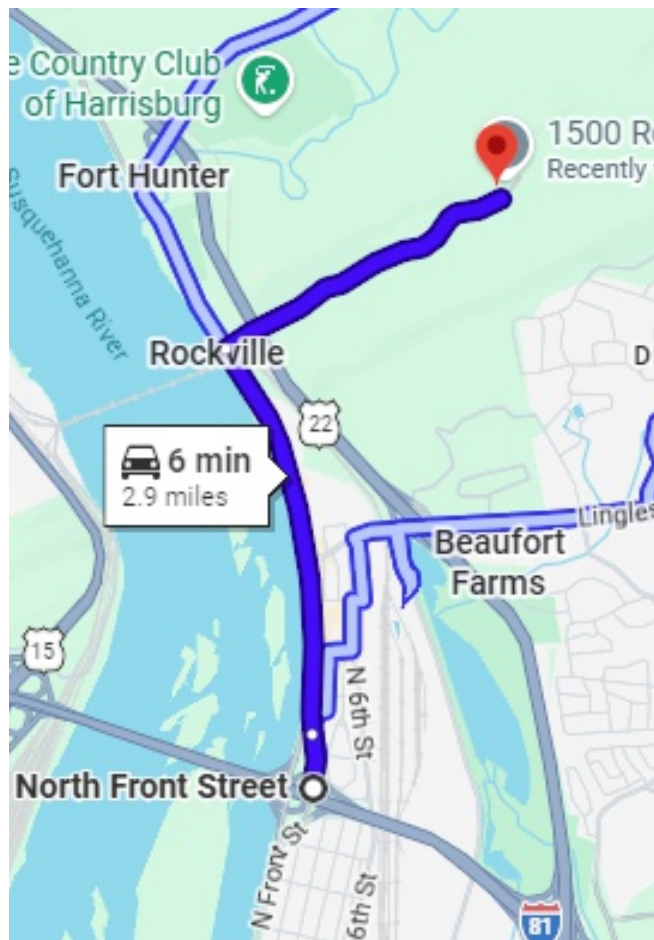

DA RULES TO KEEP EVERYONE HAPPY:

1. **HAVE FUN** and use common sense and politeness for your enjoyment and safety. This is a family-like event.
2. **ENTRANCE:** By entering or participating in the HRAC Firecracker Hamfest, you agree de facto notice to hold harmless HRAC (the renter) and the Harrisburg Postal Workers (the landlord) for losses or injury or property and person, and are subject to their representative's direction. Professional security is not provided.
3. **YOU MUST PAY TO ENTER.** Attempting to avoid payment at the designated entrance is considered statutory fraud.
4. **IF YOU LEAVE THE GROUNDS,** your ticket stub is your re-entry.
5. **A PAID TICKET** is given to you at the designated entrance, which awards prizes, and are pulled at random times during the event. However, the more tickets you buy the better your chances of winning! All award decisions are final.
6. **CHILDREN UNDER 12 ARE FREE.** Non-licensed individuals over 12 pay the full entrance fee.
7. **TAILGATING.** Although there is a flat entrance fee for tailgaters and general admission, tailgaters are asked to voluntarily limit up to 2 10' x 6' spaces. You must use any space you claim, and use only what you need.
8. **NO ILLICIT ACTIVITIES:** That means no alcohol, illegal drugs or activities, or disruptive behaviors are permitted on the property. Suspected violators will be asked to leave a) voluntarily or b) by Pennsylvania State Police. No exceptions!
9. **NO OVERNIGHT CAMPING IS PERMITTED** other than by written notice from Terry Snyder, WB3BKN. Individuals who do not have permission are considered statutory trespassing.
10. **BE KIND AND OBEY DIRECTIONS** from hamfest workers (wearing yellow reflective vests). They are volunteers who are there to answer questions and safely direct traffic. Please don't ask them to load or unload your goodies - liability prevents them from doing that! And we ain't getting any younger!

HAM HISTORY

Important Happenings in the Month of June

June is the most prominent month in amateur radio, defined globally by the massive, annual ARRL Field Day on the fourth weekend of the month. Since its inception, this tradition has served as a large-scale emergency preparedness drill, with over 31,000 operators setting up temporary stations across North America.

Key Milestones & Traditions

- **1904 (Pioneer Days):** The June issue of Amateur Work featured a ground-breaking article showcasing two 8th-grade students in Boston who had successfully built a homemade wireless plant capable of transmitting over eight miles.
- **1919–1920:** The premier publication Radio Amateur News ran its early issues before officially changing its title to Radio News.
- **1930s (Field Day Origins):** Following early efforts in 1930 and 1932 to test portable stations, the ARRL officially formalized Field Day in June 1933. It was originally designed to test if amateurs could communicate without commercial power.
- **1971:** The first issue of the beloved, Sacramento-based Worldradio magazine was published in June, catering to the international enthusiast community for decades.
- **1990:** Ham Radio magazine, which debuted in 1968, published its 268th and final issue in June after being sold to CQ Amateur Radio publishers.

Recognizing the vital emergency communication support operators provide during severe weather events (hurricanes, blizzards, floods), numerous states and local governments historically declare June as "Amateur Radio Month" or designate specific dates as "Amateur Radio Week".

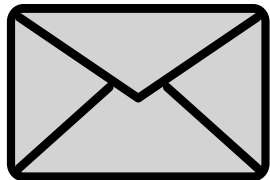
